Students are able to earn ribbons for the top 2 of each category they are doing. You will have to sign up for fair usually around a month or so ahead of time, if you have more questions ask the Advisors when the time comes closer. Every student must enter an SAE project into the fair and if not your grade will severely drop. If you raise an animal, you're able to auction it, as long as it has the required weight.
